Spice Shop

5 parts OT Black Pepper

3 parts OT Spicy

2 parts OT Ginger Spice

1 part OT Brown Sugar

This blend is a mélange of warm sweet spices, including black pepper, warm cloves, ginger and sweet vanilla with hints of cinnamon and brown sugar. Use it as is for a nice spicy holiday fragrance or blend it with traditional fall/winter fragrances for a more complex holiday blend which a richer spicy bouquet that will stand out of the traditional spicy cinnamon fragrance.

Wood Berries

3 parts OT Tonka Bean & Soft Sugar

1 part OT Pomegranate

1 part OT Voodoo Berry

An unusual combination of sparkling juicy wild berries intertwined with rich woody cedar and subtle smoky roasted tonka beans. This one is definitely not your traditional holiday fragrance. It's one of my favorite blends of this edition! I encourage you to try it. You won't be disappointed with this one!

Caribbean Blizzard

3 parts OT Coconut Breeze

1 parts OT Lime Sugar Arrogance Mix *Type*

1 parts OT Peppermint Ice

Okay, I'm making a parenthesis here as this one may be too summery, but this blend is just too yummy to keep it stored. The delicate fresh coconut notes of "Coconut Breeze" blends perfectly with the sparkling sweet notes of Lime Sugar and the cool clean mint fragrance of "Peppermint Ice". This one will transport you directly to the Caribbean !

Thai Spice

5 parts OT Coconut Breeze

2 parts OT Ginger Spice

2 parts OT Black Pepper

2 parts OT Lemongrass Sage

Give holidays a tropical Thai "flavor" with this warm blend of spices, coconut and sparkling herbal notes. It's amazing how the combination of fragrances in this blend work so nice together. The fresh coconut notes are enhanced with the refreshing citrusy herbal aroma of "Lemongrass & Sage" while "Ginger Spice" and "Black Pepper" add a sweet warm background of spices. I can imagine how nice coconut milk soaps scented with this exotic blend would smell!, just terrific!

Amaretto Cherry Cordials & Maple

5 parts OT Wood Violets & Maple

5 parts OT Chocolate Truffle

3 parts OT Cherry Garcia

2 parts OT Amaretto Royale

A mouthwatering combination of sweet red maraschino cherries soaked in amaretto liqueur, covered with the most decadent velvety chocolate and delicious hints of maple syrup and soft floral nuances. This blend calls

to be made in lotions and body butters, but I just can't imagine what products can't be made in this delicious blend.

Fragrance Highlights:

Wood Violets & Maple: This fragrance is just delightful. At first I thought this was going to be a sugary fragrance, but to my surprise the sugary maple notes are mellowed out with a wonderful light floral note and a long lasting ambry base that makes the fragrance really upscale and interesting.

Brown Sugar: This classic Oregon Trail Fragrance is the essence of brown sugar at its best. I just can't believe how realistic it is!. It works very nice in soaps and it's a must for brown sugar scrubs. Wonderful alone or blended for an infinite world of possibilities. Once you try Oregon Trail 's Brown Sugar you'll not accept any other brown sugar fragrance.

Ginger Spice: I'm yet to see a scent that can't be blended with OT's Ginger Spice!. Its true warm gingery fragrance is wonderful used alone, but goes perfectly with other spices, fruits and even florals.

Coconut Breeze: This natural smelling coconut fragrance has no vanilla, caramel or sugared toasted coconut notes in it, just a straight clean coconut scent. It's great used alone in soaps and other applications for a subtle fresh natural coconut scent and it's the perfect blender when you want a tropical coconut note without too much sweetness. Although it's not a knock in your face coconut fragrance, its delicate fresh coconut milk scent holds very well in CP. I made a batch of soap with it with fresh pureed coconut added at trace. The fragrance survived the gel stage very well and bloomed beautifully after a couple weeks of curing with no discoloration!

Lime Sugar Arrogance Mix*Schiapparelli Pinkenz Type*: Yeah it's definitely a Lime with attitude. This wonderful mouthwatering fragrance is a combination of sparkling lime and delicate sugary notes. It's AMAZING in cold process soap and stays very strong and true.
